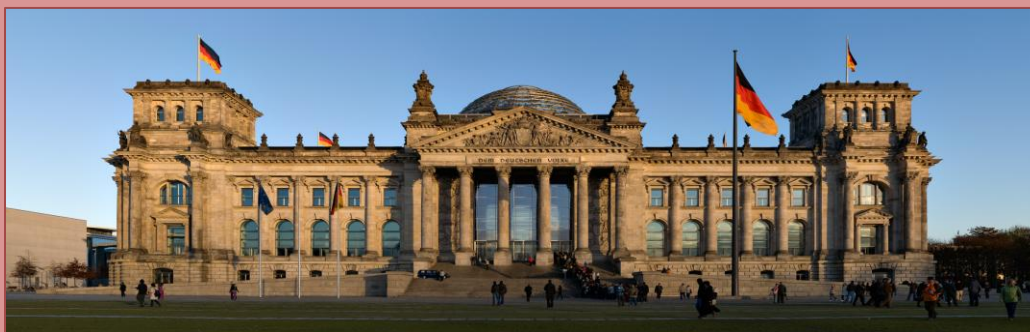


Berlin Cityguide



What to see

- **Berlin Wall** – walking the barrier that used to divide Berlin is a must, a true remaining symbol of the Cold War
- **Holocaust Memorial** – a central place for remembering the 6 million Jewish victims of the Holocaust
- **Brandenburg Gate** – one of Berlin's most important landmarks
- **Reichstag building** – the dome offers an incomparable view of the city
- **Museum Island** – a unique ensemble of five world renowned museums

Where to eat

- **Das Lokal** – beautifully decorated and popular spot for German classics
- **3 minutes sur la mer** – excellent French cuisine
- **Jolesch** – locals love this fantastic Austrian cooking venue
- **Der Goldene Hahn** – cosy trattoria perfect for Italian food lovers
- **Gasthaus Figl** – hearty German food
- **Hugos** – awarded restaurant serving haute German cuisine

Travelling around

- **From the airport – Schoenefeld airport (SFX)** – 18km from the centre. Tickets cost €3.30 and are valid for Express trains, underground, buses and trams.
- **Tegel Airport (TXL)** – the closest to the centre. Best option is the Airport Express bus, leaving every 10 minutes. Tickets are €2.70.
- **Travelling in the city** – bus, U-Bahn (underground), S-Bahn (overground) and tram are the usual travel options. Getting around is easy and customer services are available in many stations. Basic single ticket is €2.10. Day tickets for zone A to B cost €6.10. Berlin also has great night transport services.
